General Information

The San Gabriel Educational Foundation is pleased to offer the 2015 SEF Summer Academy, a tuition-based summer program.

Classes have a limited enrollment and are filled on a first-come, first-served basis. Classes are available to all students entering 9th–12th grade; residence in the district is not required, but SGUSD students have priority admission. All students outside the San Gabriel Unified School District must provide proof of immunizations and may apply after April 22, 2015.

Roosevelt Elementary School and Jefferson Middle School will also host a SEF Summer Academy program June 8–July 2. A K-8 catalog may be downloaded at SEFfor8schools.org.

HOW TO REGISTER

Students must register for the grade he or she will enter this Fall 2015.

1. Choose classes: Carefully read class descriptions, grade level served and pre-requisites, then create a class schedule. Fill out one registration form per student. Additional registration forms available for download at SEFfor8schools.org.

2. Submit completed registration form with full tuition payment, 1st payment installment (50% of full fee) or online payment receipt for each student. Registration forms without payment or online proof of payment will be considered incomplete and will delay student enrollment. Applications will not be accepted by fax or by email.

3. Registration Methods:

Live Registration: On-Campus Registration for Freshmen, Sophomores, Juniors & Seniors Saturday, April 18, 2015, 9:00a.m. – 12:00p.m. at the Gabrielino High School Student Center. Please note - only two (2) applications per individual will be accepted at Live Registration.

By Mail or Drop Off: Registration forms will be date-stamped and processed as received, until classes are full. Registration forms and payments may be dropped off ONLY at the SEF office:

Final class schedule confirmations will be emailed or mailed by May 31, 2015. Classes are filled on a first-come, first-served basis. We will contact you if the class indicated on your registration form is filled or if there is a conflict with a class. Please maintain a copy of all registration forms for your records.

SUMMER ACADEMY REGISTRATION WILL CLOSE WHEN ENROLLMENT NUMBERS HAVE BEEN REACHED. CLASSES THAT DO NOT MEET THE MINIMUM NUMBER OF STUDENTS MAY BE CANCELLED.

The San Gabriel Educational Foundation reserves the right to cancel classes, change teacher assignments, or make other decisions pertaining to enrollment and schedule of all classes for whatever reasons deemed necessary.

PRE-REQUISITES

Summer Academy credit courses can be challenging and more rigorous than the traditional school year courses for many students. For this reason, many classes have suggested prerequisites, so that parents and students can determine the potential likelihood of success in each summer course.

DROP/WITHDRAWAL POLICY

Students officially registered for the Summer Academy Get-Ahead/Credit Courses remain on the class list to receive a grade at the end of the summer session. A student who exceeds the absence limits, as stated in the Attendance Policy below, or stops attending a class without officially withdrawing will receive an "F" for the course.

Students who are struggling academically during the summer session, and do not want a substandard grade on their transcripts, may withdraw from a course with a written Drop/Withdrawal Request form. This request must be received in the SEF office NO LATER THAN June 23rd. Refunds will not be given, regardless of the reason. Students may drop or withdraw from classes in two ways:

1. In person at SEF office - complete Drop/Withdrawal Request form and place in SEF drop box. Form can also be found online at SEFfor8schools.org.
2. By mail - Print the request form, fill it out and mail it to the SEF office.

Forms that are mailed must be received in the SEF office by June 15th in order to be considered. No drop or withdrawal requests are accepted by telephone or email.

ALTERNATIVE CLASS SELECTIONS

- Acceptance of an application is not a guarantee of placement.
- We strongly suggest students include a second choice for each class period chosen. Providing alternative class selections will avoid delays in scheduling.
- Students will be contacted if their 1st class choice is full.

CLASS SCHEDULE CHANGES

Please consider your choices carefully before submitting your student's registration. Since these changes can negatively impact enrollment, teacher employment and administrative costs, a \$25 Change Request Fee will be charged for each schedule change after April 30, 2015.

PAYMENT OPTIONS

Please make Check/Money Orders payable to: San Gabriel Educational Foundation (SEF). Cash will only be accepted during the onsite/live registration.

Two-Installment Payment Plan Option: You may pay your tuition in two equal installments. The 1st half of the payment must be paid at the time of registration. The final payment is due to SEF no later than May 15, 2015. Final payments can be mailed to:

PLEASE NOTE: A copy of the on-line payment receipt/proof of payment must accompany the registration form submission. Advanced online payment is not a form of registration and is not a guarantee of class enrollment.

A \$30 fee will be charged for all returned checks. Failure to pay tuition will jeopardize student's Summer Academy enrollment.

REFUNDS

Refunds for withdrawing from the program must be in writing. Refund requests received on or before April 30, 2015 will result in a 90% reimbursement refund, less a \$30 processing fee. Refund requests received on or after May 1, 2015 but not later than May 15, 2015 will result in a 60% reimbursement refund, less a \$30 processing fee. No refunds will be given for requests received after May 16, 2015.

Before April 30th: 90% refund: \$30 fee

From May 1st–15th: 60% refund: \$30 fee

After May 16th: No refund

BEHAVIOR

Students attending SEF Summer Academy will be expected to adhere to the rules and regulations of Gabrielino High School. These can be found in the Student handbook posted on the GHS website at www.gabrielino.sgusd.net. Students dismissed for disciplinary reasons will not be eligible for any refund.

ATTENDANCE POLICY

Credit courses: Students must be present and on time each day. Students may be dropped from class following the 2nd absence regardless of the reason for the absence. No refunds will be given to students dropped from class.

Non-credit courses may also require minimum attendance hours to meet certification expectations.

Get Ahead/Credit Classes

Intermediate Speech

This course is designed for the academically motivated student who is interested in being part of a competitive speech and debate team. A major goal of this course is to prepare students for the upcoming competitive speech and debate season. The course will begin with a review of the fundamentals of communication, team work and stage presence. Instruction will continue with brief focuses on spontaneous speaking, informative speaking, oral interpretation, and debate. The remainder of the course will be devoted to preparation, revision, practice and presentations of competition speeches. During the preparation component, students will work on specific tournament techniques for the speech category the student will compete in. Students who complete the course will be eligible for Advanced Speech at Gabrielino High School.

Prerequisites: Students must have one of the following: (1) completion of a speech course at a middle school (does not apply to after school academies), (2) Course instructor approval. (Open to students entering the SGUSD grades 9-12 in the Fall)

Introduction to Art

This course introduces students to the general techniques and theories of art. The elements of line, color, texture, shape, form and value will be explored and used to create original works of art. "Into to Art" provides experience for the beginning student who has an interest in learning about different types of art media (pencil, pen, watercolor, etc.). This course serves as a pre-requisite for all other art courses.

Geometry

Logical reasoning is emphasized. Geometry is the branch of mathematics that deals with space relationships, especially in the properties and measurement of points, lines, angles, surfaces, and solids. The course is mainly plane geometry with some solid geometry included.

Pre-requisite: C Grade in Algebra 1.

8:00am-1:15pm 2 semester, 10 unit course

World History

This is a college preparatory course designed to explore the themes, patterns and events that have laid the foundation for the modern world. The course covers events ranging from human origins and cultures to patterns in world trade ending in technology and events that created modern nations. This course moves at an accelerated pace, and there is an emphasis on the analysis of historical evidence and the ability to express. The course is designed to examine the significant movements, events and turning points in 20th century with understanding in writing. **Students must be incoming 10th grade.**

8:00am-1:15pm 2 semester, 10 unit course

U.S. History

This course will review American history from the colonial era through the rise of modern America. Emphasis will be placed on the United States' role as a world leader resulting from its free political system and pluralistic nature. Areas of concentration will include: the expanding role of the federal government, the movement for equal rights for all Americans, the rise of the American economy, and the continuing conflict between state and federal rights. **Students must be incoming 11th grade.**

8:00am-1:15pm 2 semester, 10 unit course

Spanish 2

This course continues to develop proficiency in listening comprehension, speaking, reading and writing. The students will progressively develop their ability to understand and to use the Spanish language both orally and in writing. Students will further their knowledge and skill in grammatical and verb forms, and increase their comprehension of the Hispanic culture. The development of proficiency is enhanced through the use of situational and communicative exercises.

Pre-requisite: C grade in Spanish 1.

Upper Grade Pair

Two class group 8:00am-1:15pm 10 unit combo course

Government

In this course, students will review and expand their knowledge of American Government. In addition, they draw on the studies of American History and of other societies to compare different systems of government in the world today. Additionally, students will analyze the foundation and development of the ever-changing scope of government, with emphasis on the role the Constitution plays in everyday society and the basic structure and functions of government. This course should be viewed as the culmination of the civic literacy strand that prepares students to vote, to reflect on the responsibilities of citizenship, and to participate in community activities. This course is paired with the Economics semester course.

Students must be incoming 12th grade.

1 semester, 5 unit course paired with Economics

Economics

In this one semester course in economics, students will deepen their understanding of the economic problems and institutions of the nation and world in which they live. Emphasis will be placed on financial literacy where students will learn to make reasoned decisions on economic issues as citizens, workers, consumers, business owners and managers, and members of civic groups. In this course, students will add to the economic understandings they acquired in previous grades and apply tools (such as graphs, statistics, and equations) learned in other subject fields to their understanding of our economic system. This course is paired with the Government semester course.

Students must be incoming 12th grade.

1 semester, 5 unit course paired with Government

SPECIALIZED COURSES

Educational Resources ACT Prep

Educational Resources has been preparing students to take both the SAT and ACT for over 30 years. This year we are offering our ACT prep course for Gabrielino High School's summer school program because the SAT is undergoing major changes, and most students will be better served to prep for the ACT this coming year, since all of its features are well known and will remain intact. Virtually all colleges now accept either the SAT or ACT, and the ACT has actually become the more popular test with high schoolers.

Our approach balances review of fundamentals that are critical to ACT success with a strong set of strategies for all types of ACT questions. This approach has yielded excellent score improvement for ACT students over the years. Our 31-hour course includes nine 3-hour sessions and 1 full-length practice ACT. Each 3-hour session includes the teaching of strategies, review of assigned homework, and drills on the different areas of the ACT: English, math, reading comprehension, science reasoning, and the essay. The practice test, taken after the students have had 7 regular sessions, is a real ACT; it will be scored and analyzed, and then reviewed thoroughly during the next class session.

Please note: This class will meet on Tuesdays and Thursdays from 9:00 am to 12:00 pm from June 9th through July 9th. On Thursday, July 2nd, the class will meet from 8:00 am to 12:00 pm so that the full-length ACT practice test can be administered. All materials are included in the cost of the course, and the students will have ample materials to continue their preparation for the ACT after the class has been completed. Driver's Education

This course is designed for students who are considering getting their provisional license. This course is required by the state of California to learn the rules of the road and become a safe driver. Projects, lectures, discussions and various videos will be used to achieve these goals. At the completion of the class a certificate of completion will be issued, qualifying students to apply for their Learners Permit. *Materials & certificate included*
